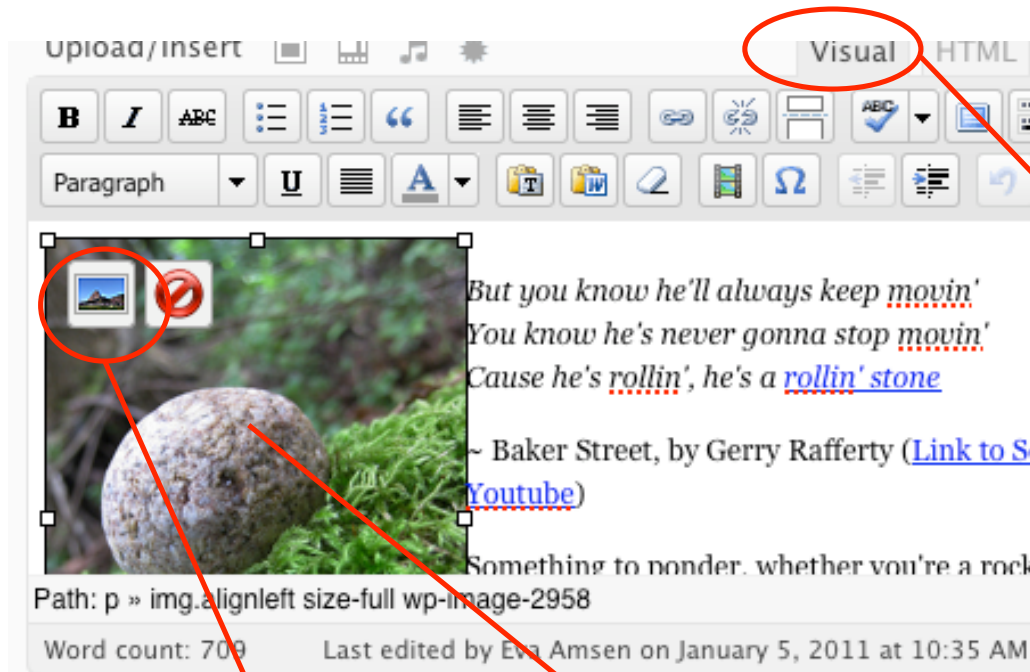


How to get space next to images on the Node



1. In visual editing mode...

2. ...click on the image...

3. ...and click this icon when it appears.

A pop-up with image settings will appear. See next page.

4. In the pop-up screen, click the “Advanced Settings” tab...
